State of New York } I, On this Eleventh Day of May in the year 1818 before  
me the subscriber first Judge of the Court of Common Pleas  
in and for the said County of Westchester, personally appears  
Isaac Doty, of a fifty six years, Resident in the Town of White Plains  
in said County of Westchester, who being by me first duly sworn  
according to Law, doth, on his Oath, make the following declaration  
in Order to obtain the provision made by the late Act of Congress  
Entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the  
Land and Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War  
That he the said Isaac Doty enlisted as a private called Pletham in  
in the State of New Jersey in the Company commanded by  
Captain John Dougherty in the second Regiment of Artillery  
commanded by Col. John Lamb; that he continued to serve in  
the same Company, and Regiment in the service of the United  
States until the end of the War, that he enlisted into the Company  
aforesaid in the fall of the year 1778 and was discharged from  
the service in the month of May or June in the year 1783 at West  
Point in the State of New York. That he was in the Battle of Spr  
field in New Jersey, and in the Battle at the Capture of Cornwallis  
at York Town, that he disposed of his Bounty Land to Col. Richard  
Platt, to whom he delivered his discharge. And that he is in  
reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of  
his Country for support; and that he has no other evidence now  
in his Power of his said services.

in the preceding declaration, against the Common Enemy; and I do  
further testify, that I know him personally to be of good moral character.  
And I now transmit the proceedings and testimony, taken and had  
before me, to the Secretary for the Department of War, pursuant to the  
directions of the aforesaid Act of Congress.
